8 The Holy Plate

A holy plate or crown (diadem) was worn on the turban. Engraved on the plate reads: "Holy to the Lord." (Exodus 28:36; 29:6)



7 Mitre (Turban): The high priest wore a mitre or turban on his head made of fine linen. (Exodus 28:4, 39)

The Censer

 On the Day of
 Atonement, the high
 priest fills a censer full
 of coals from the altar
 as well as crushed
 incense, and brings it
 into the Most Holy Place
 and offers it before the
 Lord. (Leviticus 16:12, 13)
